Magistrates please remember:

- The Notice of Temporary Suspension and Notice of Hearing (AA-137) AND the Report of Refusal to Submit to Chemical Test (AA-134) should both be sent to the Safety & Business Hearings Bureau using the mailing address or fax number provided on form AA-137 WITHIN 48 HOURS OF THE ARRAIGNMENT.
- Notify the motorist AND the police officer of the hearing date with their copy of the Notice of Hearing.
- Once you assign a hearing date and notify the motorist and police officer, **please do not reschedule or assign another date**. The Safety Hearing Unit will handle all reschedules.

Enforcement Agencies please remember:

- Provide the court with a copy of the Report of Refusal to Submit to Chemical Test (AA-134).
- This chemical test refusal hearing is independent of the criminal court case.
- Officer appearance is critical at this administrative hearing.

Police and motorist requests for adjournments should be made to 518-474-1509.

When scheduling a Motor Vehicles hearing, please use the next available date for your county, but do not use a hearing date that occurs on the same date as the arraignment. In addition to scheduling the "Time of Hearing", **New York City Courts** should also request that police officers include their tax registry number and assigned precinct on form AA-134 (Report of Refusal to Submit to Chemical Test). This information is also needed on form AA-137 (Notice of Temporary Suspension and Notice of Hearing).

Once you have assigned a hearing date, please do not reschedule a subsequent hearing date for the same case because it may create a duplicate suspension on the motorist's driving record. Moreover, rescheduling often results in situations where either the police officer or motorist is not aware of when to appear for the rescheduled chemical test refusal hearing. When the motorist or police officer wants to reschedule the assigned hearing date, have them contact the Safety and Business Hearing Bureau at (518) 474-1509.

Section 1194(2) of the Vehicle and Traffic Law requires a court to suspend the motorist's driver license at the time of arraignment, even when the scheduled date for the DMV hearing is more than 15 days after the arraignment. DMV will terminate the suspension when required by law. Courts should send form AA-137 (Notice of Temporary Suspension to Submit to Chemical Test and Notice of Hearing), and a copy of form AA-134 (Report of Chemical Test Refusal), along with the defendant's New York State driver license, if surrendered, to the Safety and Business Hearing Bureau. The effective date of the temporary license suspension for refusing to submit to a chemical test is the date of arraignment. **Do not confiscate out-of-state licenses**. In addition, be sure the police officer has copies of form AA-137 and form AA-134 to present at the hearing.

If the defendant signs the WAIVER OF HEARING FORM, it is not necessary to schedule a date for a hearing. Write "Hearing Waived" in the appropriate box on the front of the "Notice of Hearing", and complete the "Waiver of Hearing" information on the back. Send the waiver information to the Safety and Business Hearing Bureau along with the other forms, including the driver license.

The Zero Tolerance Law went into effect on November 1, 1996. It pertains to motorists under the age of 21, and imposes a disqualification of their driver license/privilege if they are found driving with an alcohol content of .02 - .07. Courts will continue to routinely process the Chemical Test Refusal Program as they have always done, while police are responsible for processing hearing requests concerning the Zero Tolerance Law. Forms used for Zero Tolerance hearings are AA-137A and AA-137A.1.

Section 25.24 of the Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation Law was amended to provide stiff penalties and sanctions for persons convicted of snowmobiling while intoxicated (SWI), snowmobiling while ability impaired (SWAI), or snowmobiling while impaired by drugs. This legislation mirrors the alcohol and drug-related violation provisions of Article 31 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law and Section 49-a of the Navigation Law, as added by Chapter 805 of the Laws of 1992, regarding boating while intoxicated. Section 49-a of the Navigation Law concerns penalties for boating while intoxicated. These include suspensions of operating privileges and a Department of Motor Vehicles hearing

for chemical test refusals. Upon arraignment on a charge of operating a vessel/snowmobile while under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and upon presentation of the police officer's refusal report, the operator's privilege to operate a vessel/snowmobile is temporarily suspended by the court pending a chemical test hearing. The suspension is effective on the arraignment date. The court's suspension pending hearing will be terminated by operation of law in 15 days or on the date of the Department of Motor Vehicles hearing, whichever comes first. This suspension must be imposed even if the hearing date will occur more than 15 days after arraignment. Further action will be taken by the Department of Motor Vehicles on the date of hearing. Use the same hearing dates as on the attached calendar.

The court will complete a Notice of Temporary Suspension & Notice of Hearing for Vessels and Snowmobiles (form AA-137V). Copies of form AA-137V must be given to the defendant and police officer; a copy should also be sent to the Department of Motor Vehicles Safety and Business Hearing Bureau and to the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Legislation with respect to zero tolerance for vessel operators became effective on April 1, 1999. That law added a new section 49-b to the Navigation Law. Vessel operators, under 21 years of age, who are suspected of a violation of section 49-b, will be detained by police and asked to submit to a chemical test. The under-21 operator will have the option of a DMV hearing or of waiving such a hearing, whether or not the chemical test is taken. If the operator requests a hearing, he/she will retain full privilege to operate a vessel until the DMV hearing. Forms used for this section of the Navigation Law are AA-137VZT and AA-137VZT.1. There is NO CONVICTION for this charge. Please use the attached calendar to schedule hearing dates.
