#### TO: All Enforcement Agencies and Magistrates

SUBJECT: Chapter 248 of the Laws of 2013 – Avoiding Collision with a Parked, Stopped or Standing Emergency Vehicle

Effective July 31, 2013, Chapter 248 of the Laws of 2013 amends Vehicle and Traffic Law (VTL) Section 1144-a to require motorists to exercise due care to avoid colliding with an authorized emergency vehicle displaying any combination of blue, red, or white lights. When approaching such an emergency vehicle, the motorist must move from a lane which contains or is immediately adjacent to the shoulder where the emergency vehicle is stopped. Prior to July 31, section 1144-a only applied to authorized emergency vehicles displaying red or white lights.

An "authorized emergency vehicle" is defined in Vehicle and Traffic Law Section 101 as: "Every ambulance, police vehicle or bicycle, correction vehicle, fire vehicle, civil defense emergency vehicle, emergency ambulance service vehicle, blood delivery vehicle, county emergency medical services vehicle, environmental emergency response vehicle, sanitation patrol vehicle, hazardous materials emergency vehicle and ordnance disposal vehicle of the armed forces of the United States."

A person who is convicted of a violation of Vehicle and Traffic Law Section 1144-a is subject to the following fines [see VTL Section 1800(b)(1)]:

- First offense no more than \$150
- Second offense (both of which are committed within 18 months) no more than \$300
- Third or subsequent offense (all of which are committed within 18 months) no more than \$450

The Department of Motor Vehicles assigns two points for this violation.

AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to the operation of vehicles when approaching a parked, stopped or standing authorized emergency vehicle

# <u>The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:</u>

1 Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 1144-a of the vehicle and traf-

2 fic law, as amended by chapter 458 of the laws of 2011, is amended to 3 read as follows:

4 (a) Every operator of a motor vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid

5 colliding with an authorized emergency vehicle which is parked, stopped

6 or standing on the shoulder or any portion of such highway and such

7 authorized emergency vehicle is displaying one or more red or combina-

8 tion red and white lights pursuant to the provisions of paragraph two of

9 subdivision forty-one of section three hundred seventy-five of this

10 chapter or is displaying one or more blue, combination blue and red or

11 combination blue, red and white lights pursuant to the provisions of

12 subparagraph b of paragraph four of subdivision forty-one of section

13 three hundred seventy-five of this chapter. For operators of motor

14 vehicles on parkways or controlled access highways, such due care shall

15 include, but not be limited to, moving from a lane which contains or is

16 immediately adjacent to the shoulder where such authorized emergency

17 vehicle displaying one or more red, blue or white or any combination of

18 red and white lights or blue or combination blue and red or combination
