SUBJECT: Chapter 387 of the Laws of 2010 – Exercising Due Care to Avoid Emergency Vehicles

Effective January 1, 2011, Chapter 387 of the Laws of 2010 amends the Vehicle and Traffic Law to require motorists to exercise due care to avoid emergency vehicles. A new Section 1144-a is added to require every operator of a motor vehicle to exercise due care to avoid colliding with an authorized emergency vehicle which is parked, stopped or standing on the shoulder or any portion of the highway when such emergency vehicle is displaying one or more red or combination red and white lights.

AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to enacting the "Ambrose-Searles move over act"

<u>The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:</u>

1 Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 the "Ambrose-Searles move over act".

3 § 2. Subdivision 3 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as 4 amended by chapter 692 of the laws of 1985, is amended to read as 5 follows:

6 3. Application for learner's permit. An application for a learner's 7 permit shall be included in the application for a license. A learner's 8 permit shall be issued in such form as the commissioner shall determine 9 but shall not be issued unless the applicant has successfully passed the 10 vision test required by this section and the test set forth in paragraph 11 (a) of subdivision four of this section with respect to laws relating to 12 traffic and ability to read and comprehend traffic signs and symbols and 13 has satisfactorily completed any course required pursuant to paragraph 14 (a) of subdivision four of this section. Upon acceptance of an applica-15 tion for a learner's permit the commissioner shall provide the applicant 16 with a driver's manual which includes but is not limited to the laws

17 relating to traffic, the laws relating to and physiological effects of

18 driving while ability impaired and driving while intoxicated, the law

Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 4 of section 502 4 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 585 of the laws of 5 2002, is amended to read as follows: 6 (i) Upon submission of an application for a driver's license, the 7 applicant shall be required to take and pass a test, or submit evidence 8 of passage of a test, with respect to the laws relating to traffic, the 9 laws relating to driving while ability is impaired and while intoxicat-10 ed, under the overpowering influence of "Road Rage", or "Work Zone Safe-11 ty" awareness as defined by the commissioner, the law relating to exer-12 cising due care to avoid colliding with a parked, stopped or standing 13 authorized emergency vehicle pursuant to section eleven hundred forty-14 four-a of this chapter, the ability to read and comprehend traffic signs 15 and symbols and such other matters as the commissioner may prescribe, 16 and to satisfactorily complete a course prescribed by the commissioner 17 of not less than four hours and not more than five hours, consisting of 18 classroom driver training and highway safety instruction or the equiv-19 alent thereof. Such test shall include at least seven written questions 20 concerning the effects of consumption of alcohol or drugs on the ability 21 of a person to operate a motor vehicle and the legal and financial 22 consequences resulting from violations of section eleven hundred nine-23 ty-two of this chapter, prohibiting the operation of a motor vehicle 24 while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. Such test shall include 25 one or more written questions concerning the devastating effects of 26 "Road Rage" on the ability of a person to operate a motor vehicle and 27 the legal and financial consequences resulting from assaulting, threat-28 ening or interfering with the lawful conduct of another person legally 29 using the roadway. Such test shall include one or more questions 30 concerning the potential dangers to persons and equipment resulting from 31 the unsafe operation of a motor vehicle in a work zone. Such test may 32 include one or more questions concerning the law for exercising due care 33 to avoid colliding with a parked, stopped or standing authorized emer-34 gency vehicle pursuant to section eleven hundred forty-four-a of this 35 chapter. Such test shall be administered by the commissioner. The

36 commissioner shall cause the applicant to take a vision test and a test

37 for color blindness. Upon passage of the vision test, the application

38 may be accepted and the application fee shall be payable.

39 § 4. The vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new section 40 1144-a to read as follows:

41 § 1144-a. Operation of vehicles when approaching a parked, stopped or

42 standing authorized emergency vehicle. Every operator of a motor vehicle

43 shall exercise due care to avoid colliding with an authorized emergency

3 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately, provided that:

4 (a) sections two and three of this act shall take effect September 1,

5 2010, except that the promulgation of any rules and regulations, and the

- 6 taking of any other actions necessary to implement the provisions of
- 7 such sections of this act are authorized and directed to be made on or

8 before the effective date of such sections of this act; and

9 (b) section four of this act shall take effect January 1, 2011.
