SUBJECT: IRP Updates Regarding Tennessee and California

Tennessee

Due to a system problem, the Tennessee International Registration Plan (IRP) data is currently not updating the National Law Enforcement Tracking System (NLETS). A timeframe for resolving the problem is not available.

Please be advised that all Tennessee apportioned vehicles are required to have IRP plates. Also, a cab card indicating the jurisdictions of travel and the registered weight for each jurisdiction must be carried in each vehicle.

California

California has begun issuing newly designed apportioned plates to vehicles that are registered in new fleets and as a replacement plate on vehicles in existing fleets. The new plates have the words "Cal Apportioned" printed in red without raised letters, and have a well in both upper corners; the sticker with the year of expiration is to be affixed in the upper right well and the sticker with the month of expiration is to be affixed in the upper left well. There are no other changes; the plate number configuration remains blue on a white background. A sample of the new plate design is attached for your reference.

Please note that California apportioned plates with one well in the upper right corner remain valid. Only the sticker with the year of expiration is required on that plate type.
