## The Parental Kidnapping Prevention Act of 1980

The 3 main provisions of the PKPA of 1980

- 1. Requires states to enforce and not modify custody determinations made by other states.
- 2. Allows access to the Federal Parent Locator Service (FPLS) to obtain address information on abductor parents and abducted children.
- 3. Directs the US Dept of Justice to apply the fugitive felon act to interstate parental kidnapping cases when a state felony warrant has been issued and authorizes the issuance of a Federal Unlawful flight to Avoid Prosecution (UFAP) Warrant.
